

Immunization Exemption Form

If the high school informs you that your Inbound student is missing immunizations, the standard protocol is to email the natural parents and inform them of the situation. Typically, the student would go get the shot, and the natural parents would pay, as prior to arrival we expect all the inbound students to get the shots so that they are up to date based on our schools' requirements.

Option B is to request an exemption:

Non-medical (personal belief or religious) exemptions

- Parents of students in grades K-12 claiming a non-medical exemption must file one annually. These exemptions expire June 30 each year.
- Parents of students in preschool or child care must file non-medical exemptions at 2, 4, 6, 12 and 18 months of age. These exemptions expire when the next vaccines are due or when the child enrolls in kindergarten.
- There are several ways to file a non-medical exemption.
 - File the online non-medical exemption form (below) with us to include in CIIS. Check with your student's school or child care to find out if it needs a paper copy of the exemption form.
 - File our downloadable form with us (see below) to include in CIIS.
 - File our downloadable form (see below) with your student's school or child care.
 - File a statement of exemption with your student's school or child care. This statement should include: the student's full name, age or date of birth, date the exemption was filed, the immunizations declined, and which type of non-medical exemption is being taken (personal belief or religious).
